Tomdoun & East Glenquoich Estate has two recognised Beats:

Poulary Beat

Very productive Beat with four main pools and numerous runs and pots to hold fish in low or high water. The fly works well here for salmon and trout and spinning is permitted during high water. Chest waders are a must. Care must be taken as water level may rise without warning, when the Quoich hydro is operating.


A Beat well suited for the big salmon rod, with wading advantageous in some pools. Always a chance of a very large trout making its way up from Loch Garry during summer and Autumn. Four named pools with Garrygulach, the last before the river reaches Loch Garry. Access is via a track to the East of Tomdoun Lodge, marked by an Estate sign.

Boat fishing permits available for three lochs: Loch Quoich, Loch Loyne & Loch Garry



Estate Fishing Rules & Regulations

A permit to fish Tomdoun & East Glenquoich Estate must be purchased before fishing commences.

Permits will be sent by email or text message, or can be collected in person from the Estate Office. Fishing is per day – one hour before sunrise to one hour after sunset.

Tomdoun and Poulary Beats:

March-June July-October

Two rods per Beat. Rotating Beats: change over at 1pm. Fly only during low water. Spinning permittted, when hydro is generating. No bait or dead bait at any time. No Sunday fishing for salmon.

All salmon and trout to be returned.

Loch Quoich:

Fly fishing, spinning and trolling permitted. No bait or dead bait at any time.

Life jackets must be worn at all times. One fish at 1lb may be retained per visit.

Loch Garry:

Fly fishing, spinning and trolling permitted. No keep nets or retaining fish.

Life jackets must be worn at all times. One fish up to 1lb may be retained per visit.

All salmon must be returned.

Loch Loyne:

Dead bait, spinning and trolling. Four rods per boat max. Four rods per person fishing on the bank. All pike to be handled and returned safely to water.

Life jackets to be worn at all times. A day permit includes 24 hours fishing plus 4x4 vehicle access. Camping is permitted; no fires without permission.
